



Engaging and supporting refugee background students 16+

Some post compulsory pathways are not immediately appropriate or well suited to the needs and education experiences of refugee background students.

This training forum will involve a panel of those working with this cohort in various settings, and will

- Explore case studies of refugee background young people engaging in education at this level, highlighting factors that contributed to experiences of both success and further challenge
- Identify the range of programs and pathway options available across the education sector and explore opportunities to incorporate these practices in mainstream settings
- Explore whole school strategies to support young people as they negotiate post compulsory education.

Prerequisite: School's In for Refugees or equivalent workshop.

Cost: The training is free however participants *must* complete the registration form and return it via fax/email/post.
