
## From the Chair

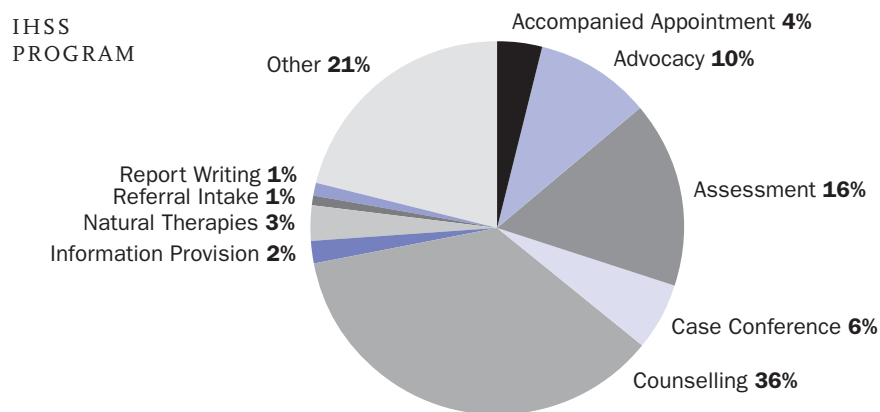
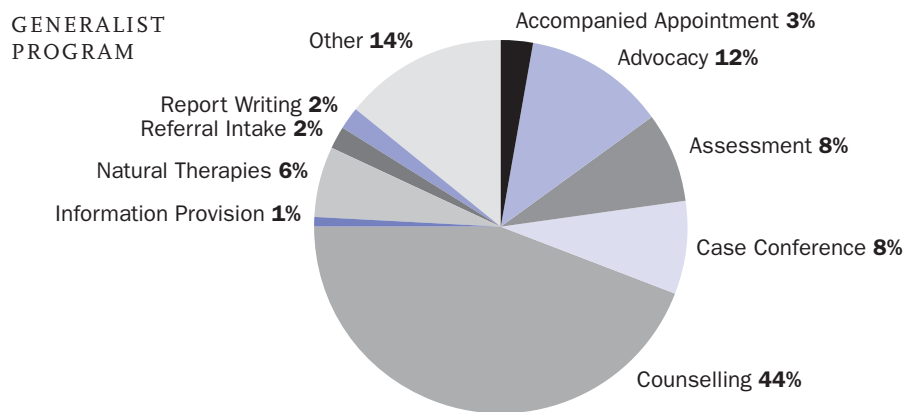

Auditor's Report for the year ended 30 June 2007

## **INDEPENDENT AUDIT REPORT**

To the members of The Victorian Foundation for Survivors of Torture Inc

### **Report on the Financial Report**

I have audited the accompanying financial report of The Victorian Foundation for the Survivors of Torture Inc. which comprises the balance sheet, income statement, statement of recognised income and expenses, and statement of cash flows, accompanying notes to the financial statements, and the statement by the members of the committee for the year ended 30 June 2007.

### Committee's Responsibility for the Financial Report

The committee of the association is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial report in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards (including the Australian Accounting Interpretations) and the Associations Incorporations Act (1981) (VIC). This includes responsibility for establishing and maintaining internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of the financial report that is free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, selecting and applying appropriate accounting policies, and making accounting estimates that are reasonable in the circumstances.

### Auditor's Responsibility

I conducted an independent audit of the financial report in order to express an opinion on it to the members of the association. My audit was conducted in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards. These Auditing Standards require that we comply with relevant ethical requirements relating to audit engagements and plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance whether the financial report is free from material misstatement.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial report. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgment, including the assessment of the risk of material misstatement of the financial report, whether due to fraud or error. The auditor considers internal control relevant to the entity's preparation and fair presentation of the financial report in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the entity's internal control. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of the accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates made by the committee, as well as the overall presentation of the financial report.

I believe that the audit evidence I have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis of my audit opinion.

#### Independence

In conducting my audit, I have complied with the independence requirements of Australian professional ethical pronouncements.

#### Qualification

As is common for organisations of this type, it is not practicable for The Victorian Foundation for the Survivors of Torture Inc. to maintain an effective system of internal control over donations, subscriptions, and other fund-raising activities until their initial entry in the accounting records. Accordingly, my audit in relation to fund-raising was limited to amounts recorded.

#### Auditor's Opinion

In my opinion, except for the effects on the financial report of such adjustments, if any, as might have been required had the limitation on our audit procedures referred to in the qualification paragraph not existed; the financial report of The Victorian Foundation for Survivors of Torture Inc. is in accordance with:

Section 30 (3A) of the Associations Incorporation Act (1981) (VIC) including:

- (i) giving a true and fair view of the financial position of The Victorian Foundation for Survivors of Torture Inc at 30 June 2007 and its performance for the year ended on that date; and
- (ii) complying with Australian Accounting Standards (including the Australian Accounting Interpretations) and the Associations Incorporations Act (1981) (VIC)
